

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NOMINATION PROCESS

STEP 1: PERFORMED BY THE HOME UNIVERSITY

Mobility Coordinator from home university must nominate their students using the *International Exchange Student Nomination Form.*

STEP 2: PERFORMED BY THE STUDENT

The students will receive an email with instructions. They must fill out an **application form** and send the following documents:

- · Presentation letter from home university
- · Transcript of records with GPA
- · Passport photocopy (ID page)
- 1 photo (3x4 cm)
- Résumé/CV (in English or Spanish)
- · Medical certificate of good health
- B1 Spanish level certificate, issued by the Language Department of the home university or any other Language Center
- Motivation letter, maximum of two pages (in English or in Spanish)

Additional documentation for graduate mobility

One academic reference letter





After receiving the admission letter, the student must send the following documents:

- Visa
- · International health insurance
- Airplane tickets

NOTE: Students interested in extending their mobility program must send authorization from their home university and the renewal of their visa, foreigner ID, and international health insurance..


MIGRATORY PROCESS

For study programs not exceeding 180 days, there are nationalities exempted from the visa requirement. For additional information regarding the immigration procedure and requirements please visit the website of Colombia's Ministerio de Relaciones Exteriores.

HOUSING

The Icesi University does not have on-campus dormitories or residences, but it provides a website with various accommodation offers and options called 'Vive como en casa'. Additionally, the International Relations Office assists students in the accommodation procurement process and recommends Inside-Boho as an alternative. In the event of a change in residence, students are required to inform the International Relations Office
