## **HOW TO STUDY ABROAD**

#### **RESEARCH**

Review your remaining UCLA degree requirements (GE, pre-major, major, minor, foreign language, & upper division units).

### **IDENTIFY**

Find UCEAP courses and identify options that are comparable to your degree requirements. They do not have to be an exact match.



#### **DISCUSS**

If you have questions, meet the advisors at the International Education Office to review program details and locate syllabi.



#### **PETITION**

Meet with Communication Advisor to petition to apply study abroad coursework toward your degree requirements.

- Pre-approvals are not provided by the Communication department. Therefore, you will know before your program starts whether you will be receiving credit for coursework.
- Of note, all coursework you plan to take abroad and apply toward GE credit must be presented to your advising unit (i.e. Center for Academic Advising at the College, Honors, Athletics, Academic Advancement Program).
- All UCEAP courses count toward upper division units; therefore, even if your department denies your petition, you will still make progress toward your degree
- Study abroad is possible as soon as the summer after your first year through the Fall after your senior year. If going after senior year, meet your major advisor to adjust your graduation

#### **MAJOR SPECIFIC INFORMATION**

Lower Division Major Prep	Yes. Lower division prep can be satisfied if it is has been approved through that department (i.e. Econ 1 for Economics Department).
Major Electives	<b>Yes.</b> However, students can petition for a maximum <u>ONE</u> course to apply towards upper division electives if is covers "global" communication content, not limited or specific to a particular country. Of note, the following courses must be taken at UCLA: Comm 100, Comm 150, Common Core courses, and Practicum.
List of Pre-Approved Coursework?	<b>No.</b> The Communication department is not keeping a record of study abroad coursework that has been approved in the past.
