### HOW TO STUDY ABROAD



#### RESEARCH

Review your remaining UCLA degree requirements (GE, pre-major, major, minor, foreign language, & upper division units).



#### IDENTIFY

Find UCEAP courses and identify options that are comparable to your degree requirements. They do not have to be an exact match.



#### DISCUSS

If you have questions, meet the advisors at the International Education Office to review program details and locate syllabi.



#### PETITION

Meet with Education Advisor to learn how to apply study abroad coursework toward your degree requirements.

- \* The School of Education and Information Studies grants pre-approvals for study abroad coursework. Students must provide *both* the syllabus and course description upon review.
- \* All UCEAP courses count toward upper division units; therefore, even if your department denies your petition, you *will* still make progress toward your degree.
- \* Study abroad is possible as soon as the summer after your first year through the Fall after your senior year. If going after senior year, meet your major advisor to adjust your graduation term.

### MAJOR SPECIFIC INFORMATION

<b>Lower Division Major Prep</b>	<b>No.</b> The Education and Social Transformation major does not have articulation agreements with international universities for EDUC 10, 11, or 35. Students should look into taking GEs or foreign language if they're looking for lower division units.
<b>Major Electives</b>	<b>Yes.</b> However, the following courses <b>cannot</b> be taken abroad: EST Area of Competency courses, EDUC 180, EDUC 181. Of note, we've only approved study abroad courses for our upper division elective for the major.
<b>List of Pre-Approved Coursework?</b>	<b>No.</b> The School of Education and Information Studies is not keeping a record of pre-approved study abroad coursework.
