# CONSIDER YOUR MOTIVATIONS FOR STUDY ABROAD:

- Personal Goal(s): What personally motivates you for this? (Personal interests, family background, etc.)
- Academic Goal(s): What classes do you need to take before graduation that you might take abroad?
- Professional Goal(s): What do you want to achieve or experience that will help you in your future career?

Consider the following topics as you research study abroad. Your responses to the following statements will help you and/or the study abroad advisor narrow program options based on your personal circumstances and interests.

# **ACADEMICS:**

- Do you want courses to apply to your major, minor, core requirements or general education?
- How flexible are you with the courses you can take abroad?
- Do you want to study something different from your major?
- Have you discussed studying abroad with your academic advisor?
- Are you aware that you will be receiving TRANSFER credits (credits and grades) for courses taken overseas and that these grades will not be factored into your GPA?
- Have you examined the available courses offered at the study abroad program to which you intend to apply? Will the courses work for your major, minor, or general education requirements?
- Do you meet your preferred program(s) eligibility requirements (GPA ,foreign language, pre-requisites)?

#### LOCATIONS:

- Where do you want to/not want to study abroad?
- Are you open to any location as long as you can meet your objectives/goals?
- Are you willing to consider other locations if they're cheaper or provide other benefits to you?
- How much traveling do you plan to do while overseas in your free time?
- Do you prefer a large cosmopolitan city with a vibrant social life or a more culturally rich local city?
- Are you planning to participate in a language program?
- Would you prefer to study in an English-speaking country? In a country where English is widely spoken? Doesn't matter as long as courses are in English?
- What kind of climate do you prefer?
- Do you have dietary restrictions? Are you food adventurous?

# **FINANCES / COST:**

- Are you receiving federal financial aid? When will your financial aid get disbursed?
- Are you receiving any scholarship(s) that can be applied?
- Do you plan to secure additional loans to finance your term abroad? What are the pros/cons?
- If cost is your primary focus, will you consider less expensive programs so you can study abroad?
- Have you saved any money? Do you plan to work part time?
- How much is needed before travel vs. while you are abroad?
- Is a semester, summer, or winter term more affordable?
- Will you be able to afford additional activities while abroad?

### TIMING:

- Are you fairly flexible and can study abroad anytime within the next 2+ years, or can you only study abroad "next semester/this summer/next academic year"?
- What is your ideal program length (1-3 weeks, 4 weeks or more, a semester, an academic year)?

# PERSONAL IDENTITY:

- What aspects of your personal identity are important to consider when studying abroad?
- Are there locations that may be more safe and comfortable spaces for you to express your personal identity?
